2. Quality of the program

A. Written Feedback

1. For the contact session organised from 31st August to 2nd September we could not take up feedback from participants as the attendance was very poor on second day. Also there were new participants for the second day. So we just went through the main themes of the books (3 to 5), what exactly these books deal with.
2. For the second contact session for batch 1, we conducted an evaluation of the programme on the prescribed format designed as well as individual verbal feedback from each of the participants. The gist of which is as follows:
 - a. 80 % of the participants enjoyed a lot about the course while 20% did enjoyed some
 - b. 74% responded that they have learned a lot of new knowledge and ideas while 13% some and rest 13% a little.
 - c. 53% will apply the learning's a lot while rest 47% will apply some of the new learning's and
 - d. 67% think that the new ideas and information they have received will improve their effectiveness and results in their work situation.
3. The overall feedback on trainers was that they enjoyed the participatory approach of learning as well as the group works they had assigned in between. Allowing them to present their group discussion from the presenters' side helped them to build up their confidence which they could practice in future, while they will conduct training.
