served as an advisor to governments and UN agencies. He also serves on the International Malnutrition Task Force and was on the UN Standing Committee on Nutrition and the Knowledge Network on Globalisation of the WHO Commission on Social Determinants of Health. Prof. Sanders has received the Nutrition Society of South Africa Award in 2002, an Honorary Doctorate from UCT in 2012, and serves on the Management Committee of South Africa's Centre of Excellence on Food Security and is Co-Chair of the Global Steering Council of Peoples Health Movement.

He has published extensively in peer reviewed journals on primary health care, child health, and nutrition. He is the author of three books:

- The Struggle for Health
- Ouestioning the Solution
- Fatal Indifference: The G8. Africa and Global Health.
